
Medication Administration Hybrid Training (5 hours total)

The first part (A) is taken on line, and includes 5 parts. The second **part (B)** is completed in a face to face, group training. Individuals must bring the completed quizzes from part A, to attend the second face to face part B. *Training hours can only be verified when the participant successfully completes* **both parts A and B**.
